The proprietors likewise sent over several cannon, and other warlike implements, which their agents placed on the northeast point of Great Island, at the mouth of the great harbour, which they called Fort Point. They laid out the ground about a bow-shot from the water side, to a high rock, on which it was intended, in time, to build the principal fort."
